

As a parent, grandparent, aunt, or just a member of our community, we all have an obligation to make the world a safe place for all children. We need to understand the importance of child protection factors and how we can support families and children in our communities.

What can you do to support the mission of PCA IL? Donate, order PCA IL materials and share them at your local schools, libraries, and churches. Sponsor a child abuse prevention training at work, or again even at your local schools, libraries and churches. The more people that are aware and knowledgeable, the more people that are watching over our children. Raise money to buy Pinwheels and plant multiple Pinwheel Gardens in April – in front of schools, libraries, and along the main streets in or into town. Hold an event the day of the planting and get families and community leaders involved. Raise awareness regarding water safety for children, as this is the second-leading cause of death in Illinois children under five years old. Reach out to your local library, day care centers, community pools and share the facts regarding water safety for children. You can also download and print copies of the PCA IL Safe Water Coloring books that can be used to teach children and parents the importance of water safety.

The 22nd Annual Prevent Child Abuse Illinois Conference will be held October 20-21, 2016. GFWC Illinois will again provide gift baskets for this event. Please contact me if you or your club would like to donate a basket.

The Illinois Juniors will continue to support the Children's Research Hospital, Prevent Child Abuse Illinois, Advocates for Children, March of Dimes and St. Jude. In addition, Director Jeanette would like Junior club's across the state to support deserving organizations in their communities.



#### SET SAIL IN HELPING DESIGN BETTER LIVES THROUGH PUBLIC ISSUES

During this administration we are going to explore new possibilities and explore ways to help our members. There are so many endless projects and programs in the Public Issues spectrum and our goal is to educate our members so that they can become more involved in the cause.

- **Citizenship:** celebrate patriotism, educate members in flag etiquette and proper disposal of tattered flags. Explore historic sites and monuments in your area. Encourage members to exercise their 19th amendment and get out and vote in the upcoming elections.
- Veterans Affairs: Promote legislation in support of veterans issues. Participate in Honor Flight which pays tribute to the 53,000 Chicago area World War II and Korean War Veterans. We will be seeking volunteers to attend and participate in opportunities that become available at community veterans facilities. You can also support the USO (United Service Organization), Sew Much comfort and Canine Companions for Independence for Wounded Warriors.
- **Emergency and Disaster Preparedness**: Educate communities on the need for emergency provisions such as severe weather and other related disasters. Develop community programs and coalitions to address disaster recovery and relief.
- **Safety and Crime Prevention**: Educate members and local communities on home, and transportation safety, including bikes, rail, and air. We are also going to focus on **Illinois Fire Safety Alliance Camp "I am Me"** This is a special and unforgettable one-week camp experience for children and teenagers who have experienced injuries from burns.
- We will also be concentrating on the American Indian Center in Chicago. Clubs
  are encouraged to support the center through monetary donations or donations of clothing school supplies and food items.



Here are just a few ideas that you can implement within your own clubs and within your communities to help others improve through education. (And please utilize us as a resource to assist your clubs! We're happy to help in any way!)

- The Illinois Leadership Seminars (ILS) At Summer Seminar we heard from 4 very poised young ladies who are all alumni from ILS. This 3-day seminar helps high school sophomores to "grow as a person, a leader and most importantly as themselves." This seminar is open to 1 individual from each high school in Illinois. ILS fundraises during the year to be able to provide this wonderful leadership seminar free of charge to these students. Your club can help by donating funds to ILS. In addition, please make your local high schools aware of this wonderful opportunity!
- Provide a scholarship in any amount to a young woman starting her college career or to a woman returning to school to improve her current situation. Model your scholarship after GFWC and use volunteering as your top criteria.
- Start a Book Club within your club.
- Provide school supplies to children in need. Contact your local school districts and homeless shelters to determine where the need is and organize a backpack/school supply drive to kick off your club year. If there isn't a need in your local community, feel free to contact these larger organizations: "Schools on Wheels" www.schoolonwheels.org, "Room to Read" www.roomtoread.org, "City Year" www.cityyear.org and "Cradles to Crayons" www.cradlestocrayons.org would be more than happy to receive your donations.
- Support your local library by promoting a library card sign-up month. You could also host an event at the library and possibly bring in a speaker or provide crafts or story time for the kids.
- Apply for a GFWC Focus on Literacy Grant up to \$200 is available to individual clubs to improve literacy in our local communities.

They set out to collect luggage and back packs for children in foster care. Many of these children carry their personal belongings in trash bags. Their efforts resulted in 800 pieces. Special thanks goes to Alexander Movers, which donated a truck and three employees to deliver the luggage to the Chicago Housing Authorities, residential facility in Evanston.

Carla Herr registered the project with Make a Difference Day and the result was an incredible award of \$10,000 which was be given to Vera Junge, CHA Volunteer/ Internship coordinator. Carla Herr and her husband, Terry, were on hand in Washington, DC to accept the award which was later presented to Vera Junge. Ms. Junge stated, "Thanks again so much-your group of 11 MEM-BERS is going to make the trauma of moving from to home to home much easier and give our foster kids some dignity and self-worth. We are so thankful."


