Congratulations to all clubs who submitted award entries and were recognized by their Districts, GFWC Illinois and/or GFWC! Thank you for engaging your current members and reaching out to recruit new members. For the first time since 1996, GFWC Illinois experienced an increase in membership, and welcomed three new clubs – Gifford Woman's Club, Impact Makers of Palatine, and Peoria Woman's Club.

As an organization, we strived to successfully accomplish a few goals. You embraced the need for change, enabling our successes!

- Moved our office to a smaller space, reducing our expenses and completing an inventory of our historical papers and artifacts.
- Streamlined our dues remittance process, which improved our cash flow and reduced the time required to update our membership database.
- Changed the award entry process to submit all entries to a single email address.
- Held an in-person statewide conference and brought back the "speed dating" concept of sharing information.
- Adopted a GFWC Illinois Diversity, Equity and Inclusion statement, which was the result of a conversation at a Wisdom from the Wizard Zoom call in September.
- Successfully launched our efforts to host the 2024 GFWC Convention by fundraising and gathering the volunteer chairmen needed.



- Hosted an informative, fun-filled 2023 GFWC Illinois Convention in Bloomington.
- Invited the 2023 GFWC Convention attendees to the 2024 GFWC Convention in Chicago.

Most importantly, we are not done! Over the next 12 months, we will continue to prepare for hosting the GFWC 2024 Convention in Chicago, host a virtual Summer Seminar, support the GFWC National Day of Service to combat food insecurity, and communicate regularly with you, the GFWC Illinois clubwoman, through GFWC Illinois Connections (our email newsletter) and Wisdom from the Wizard zoom calls.

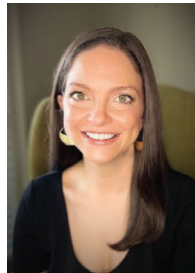

JUNIOR & JUNIORETTE LEADERSHIP CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

One of the greatest takeaways a clubwoman can get from GFWC is leadership experience. Since our Junior Clubs are geared towards younger women, many of these members are developing their professional careers. Our leadership tools are infrequently used at the club level and are a missed development opportunity for clubs and clubwomen alike. By developing a club-level leadership program, members can take on more roles in their club, their career, and in the community and be more comfortable running for district and state positions.

To qualify, clubs will need to complete six monthly leadership activities. They must cover at least six of the eight topics listed below.

1. GFWC History
2. Self-Development
3. Team Development
4. Strategic Thinking and Acting
5. Innovation
6. Fundraising
7. Legislation
8. Communication and Public Speaking

A comprehensive list of both GFWC and external training material to be utilized for the completion of this program is available in the Digital Library under “J”.

Clubs will submit a summary of the leadership activities completed and number of members in attendance for each session by May 15, 2024, to be recognized at next year’s Annual Convention. Clubs will also be listed on the website as a “Junior Leadership Designated Club” and are encouraged to self-promote as well.

If your club intends to participate, please submit the form to the Director of Junior Clubs, Katie Moydell, at kmoydell@gfwc.org by October 1, 2023.

I hope you will join me in providing training that is relevant to the needs of Junior members and will provide GFWC with leadership for the future. ■

#HATNOTHATE | GFWC ILLINOIS ARTS & CULTURE COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAM

Members throughout Illinois are encouraged to participate in the #HATNOTHATE project, which encourages kindness through creativity. People who knit, crochet, or loom are asked to make blue hats, which are distributed to schools either locally or throughout the country. The hats are blue because blue represents awareness, peace, and solidarity and is the color to wear in support of bullying prevention. Hats can be mailed to #HATNOTHATE, taken to area drop-off locations, or given to local schools. The addresses to mail and drop off hats will be provided when that information is available. If your club wishes to work with a local school or community program, please share the #HATNOTHATE resource page with the principal or director and obtain permission to initiate the project. If you do not knit, crochet, or loom, consider purchasing yarn for those who do. Reach out to knitters, crocheters, and loomers in your area and ask them to help support the cause. Hats are shared with youth in October, which is National Bullying Prevention Month.

#HATNOTHATE was founded in 2018 by Shira Blumenthal. Because she was bullied in the 4th grade, Shira decided to begin #HATNOTHATE to support other students who are bullied. Her wish is that the hats will empower students to be strong and stand up to bullying and feel encouraged by the love and purpose with which the handmade hats are created.

PLEASE CONSIDER ADOPTING #HATNOTHATE AS A CLUB PROJECT SOON. THEN MEMBERS CAN BEGIN MAKING HATS AND CONTACTING FAMILY MEMBERS, FRIENDS, AND RESIDENTS OF THE COMMUNITY TO KNIT, CROCHET, AND LOOM THIS SUMMER. HATS SHOULD BE SHARED WITH STUDENTS IN OCTOBER.

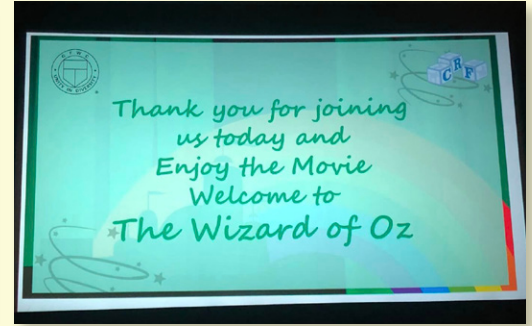


GFWC ILLINOIS WELCOMES THREE NEW CLUBS!

GFWC IL ENVIRONMENT | UPCYCLED ART CHALLENGE

We are challenging all members/clubs to help improve our environment by reusing items in a positive way to keep them out of landfills! Look at the things you would probably throw away with new eyes. Can they be combined in a way to make a useful piece of art? Something for the yard, the house, a friend or a party? What about for a school room or to draw attention to something?

You can go back to March 1, 2023, if there was something you were working on, and you have until March 1, 2024, to complete it! Work together as a club, as a committee or as an individual. Brainstorm ideas! Send pictures of your completed project – how easy is that?! If you're a winner, you can bring your creation to Convention and listen to all of the "ooohs" and "aaahs" as sisters admire your work.

And here's an additional challenge: If your recycled art helps in some way with combating food insecurity, the winner in this challenge will receive a \$25 gift card to be used toward providing food for your local food pantry. How can recycled art help with food insecurity? Try a sculpture that draws attention to your local food pantry or create reusable bag(s) out of recycled materials that food pantries can use to distribute food to their clients.

2023–2024 GFWC Illinois Upcycled Art Contest Official Rules

- 1. Creation Period** | March 1, 2023 to March 1, 2024.
- 2. Entry Deadline** | Must be in Chairman's hands by March 7, 2024.
- 3. Eligibility** | Contest is open to all members.
- 4. Qualifications** | Projects must be made of at least 75% materials that would otherwise be destined for the recycle bin or landfill.
- 5. Size** | Just be reasonable. 24" wide x 24" deep and 30" high maximum is requested.
Weight | No more than 25 pounds. No more than three entries per person.
- 6. Email 2 or 3 photographs** (from different angles) to the Environment Chairman, mhoward4030@sbcglobal.net no later than March 7th, 2024. Include an entry form with details, including the title of the work, category, list of recycled materials and other items used (glue, etc.), size, artist's name, club, district, address and phone number. Please designate which items are being recycled.
- 7. Winner Selection** | Winners will be selected by judges. The categories are:
Home Decor | Jewelry | Sculpture | Garden | Miscellaneous
- 8. Winners** will be asked to bring their item to the GFWC Illinois Convention. There will be a certificate for the winner in each category.
