# GFWC RESOLUTIONS

In case you were wondering...

...Resolutions are the "heartbeat" of an organization. GFWC Resolutions reflect the goals of our organization and tell a story of who we are and what we stand for. When you review GFWC Resolutions (located in the Member Portal at GFWC.org>Member Login>Digital Library>Resources>R>Resolutions Booklet 2022) you will note that they are divided into the **Special Program** or **Community Service Program** that the resolution relates to.

Resolutions are on a cycle to be reviewed every four years per the "GFWC Standing Rules: Resolutions," which are printed at the beginning of the Resolutions Booklet. During the June 2023 International Convention, resolutions from **Civic Engagement & Outreach** and **Education & Libraries** were reviewed, updated as needed, and presented to and voted on by the GFWC membership. The updated resolutions will be published in the Member Portal soon.

The Resolutions Committee has already begun reviewing and researching resolutions under Health & Wellness for the 2024 Convention.



While individual members are not able to bring new or updated resolutions to the GFWC Resolutions Committee, they can bring their suggestions/ concerns to their club who can then take it to their State Federation to act upon. (Check your State's procedures.) Once the State Federation acts upon a resolution, they may present the new or updated GFWC Resolution to the GFWC Resolution Committee before November 1 for consideration. Last year two states presented potential resolutions for consideration. One was integrated into an existing resolution, and another (Ohio!) became its own resolution.

We encourage each GFWC member to read the GFWC Resolutions as well as their State's Resolutions to see the big picture of what GFWC is working for.


